Center for Community Solutions (CCS)

1-888-385-4657 CCS shelters and hotline are remaining open. Crisis hotline is free, confidential, and operates 24/7 in Spanish and English.

CRC 24/7 domestic violence hotline and emergency shelters are operating as usual. Case managers and counselors are primarily offering phone sessions. (Spanish available)

YWCA San Diego County

YWCA offers shelter and services for Domestic Violence Victims/Survivors 24/7, their hotline is free, confidential and operates 24/7. Availability for singles, families: small and large. Spanish available.

Family Justice Center (FJC)

Physical location is temporarily closed to the public, but the FJC staff are providing telephonic advocacy, resource referrals, and safety planning services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and sex trafficking. Monday – Friday 8:00am-5:00pm. Community Partners continue to offer services remotely.

- Therapists are providing services through telehealth. Forensic examinations continue to be on site.
- Palomar Health is implementing procedures if a DV and/or SA victim has symptoms of COVID-19.
- San Diego Police Department, DV Unit still on site but they are not offering police reports to DV clients. If police reports are needed, it can be done at SDPD headquarters downtown.
- Restraining order attorneys are starting phone consult systems. There are challenges to assisting clients remotely. Court houses are mostly closed until April 3 but ex parte requests for gun violence restraining orders and domestic violence restraining orders are still be accepted.
