The summer meal program is funded through the United State Department of Agriculture and operated by the San Diego Unified School District.

Jewish Family Service (JFS) of San Diego - Hand Up Food Pantry, Community Food Distribution (858) 637-3210

Provides food bags to those in need due to homelessness, financial difficulties, or other transitional and/or crisis issues and emergency food. Food bags are considered supplemental to other resources, available for people with dietary restrictions and is available to any person regardless of race, age or religion. Non-perishable items, bread, fresh produce, hygiene items, and other perishables are available.

Community Christian Service Agency - Emergency Food Pantry, CCSA Clairemont Center (858) 274-2273

Provides emergency services to low-income individuals and families. Emergency food is available up to six times per year and eight times for seniors, clothing and hygiene items are also available to those in need.
